- Best in part shade conditions
- Blooms blue, July-October
- Annual if seeds sown in fall,
 Biennial if sown in spring
- Good for naturalizing

HELPFUL TIPS:

Prefers rich soil. Adaptable to clay soil (consistently moist). Provide shade from afternoon sun. Drops leaves in drought.

COMPANIONS: Cardinal Flower, Cutleaf Coneflower, Wild Geranium, Boneset, Marsh Marigold, White Turtlehead, Fringed Loosestrife, Marsh Cinquefoil
