PERENNIAL VINE



Moonseed Menispermum canadense



- Dioecious (male/female)
- Blooms white, May-June
- Groundcover/twining vine
- Native to woods & thickets
- Not ideal for small spaces

HELPFUL TIPS:

Toxic from root to leaf tip. Fruit can be confused with wild grapes. Fatal to mammals if ingested. Useful for erosion control on wooded slopes.

OTHER NATIVE VINES: Wild Cucumber, Purple Passion Flower, Virign's Bower Clematis, Trumpet Vine, Coral Honeysuckle, American Hog Peanut, Wild Yam
