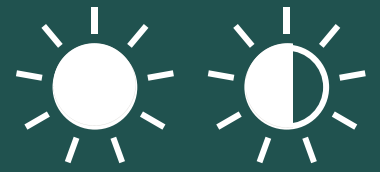

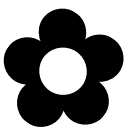


- Native to wetland habitats
- Blooms purple, June-Sept
- Snapdragon-like flowers
- Spreads by seeds and rhizomes
- Useful around pond/rain garden

FUN FACTS:

Best sited in part shade with soil that does not dry out. The flowers are said to resemble a monkey's face.

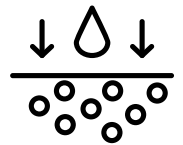
