


- Mildly fragrant flowers

- AKA Wild Blue Phlox


HELPFUL TIPS:

Prefers rich, humusy, moist soil that is well-drained. Spreads slowly by rhizomes. May be browsed by rabbits. Watch for powdery mildew.

COMPANIONS: Wood Poppy, Hairy Wood Mint, Blue Cohosh, Wild Geranium, Waterleaf, Aniseroot, Virginia Bluebells, Early Meadow Rue, Bishop's Cap, Ferns




