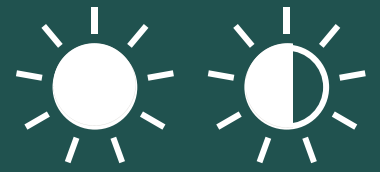

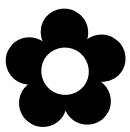


- Native to high quality wetlands
- Blooms pink, July-Sept
- Urn-shaped seed capsules turn red & persist in winter
- AKA Meadow Pitchers

HELPFUL TIPS:

Benefits from part sun or shade from taller perennials. It is buzz pollinated by bumble bees. Found in swamps/bogs/seeps.

COMPANIONS: White Turtlehead, Great Blue Lobelia, Rose Milkweed, Queen of the Prairie, Mountain Mint, Blazing Star, Common Boneset, Cutleaf Coneflower, Coreopsis

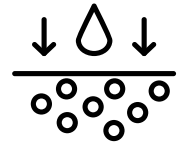
Low Growing

Height: 1-2 feet
Spacing: 18-24 inches

Soil: Peat, Acidic, Sandy
