


- Woods, meadows, riverbanks
- Blooms yellow, July-Oct
- Attractive along fence rows
- Colony-forming; rhizomatous
- AKA Wild Golden Glow

HELPFUL TIPS:

Reaches full height in moist soil, shorter in drier locations. May overwhelm small landscapes. Prefers part sun. Long blooming.

COMPANIONS: Swamp Rose Mallow, Joe Pye Weed, Ironweed, Common Boneset, Rose Milkweed, Northern Sea Oats, Cardinal Flower, Creek Sedge, Calico Beardtongue




