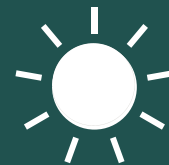

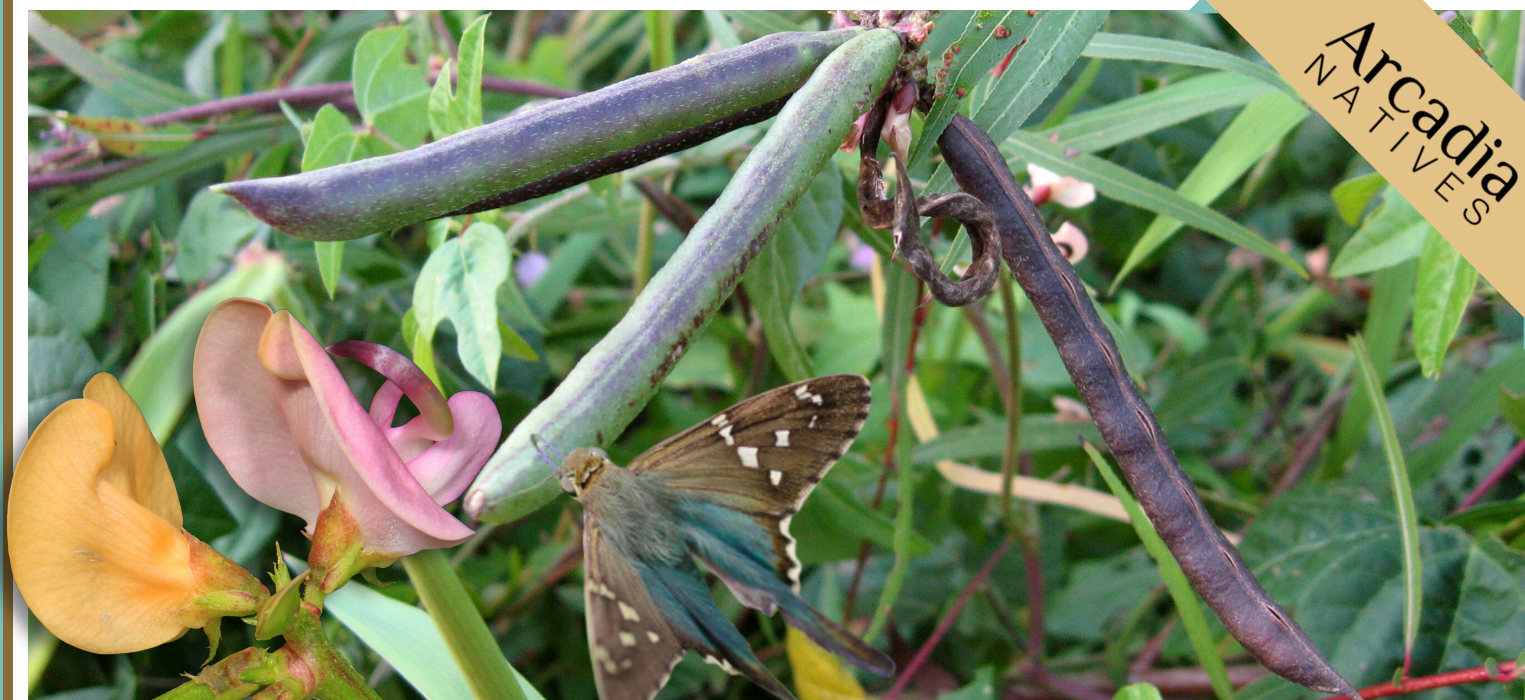


# Trailing Fuzzybean

LONG-TAILED SKIPPER

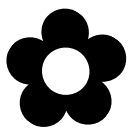


- Historical culinary/medicinal uses

- AKA Trailing Wild Bean

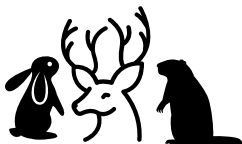
### FUN FACTS:

*COMPANIONS: Purple Giant Hyssop, Partridge Pea, Pale Spiked Lobelia, Tall Thimbleweed, Tall Coreopsis, Big Bluestem, Foxglove Beardtongue, Bee Balm*



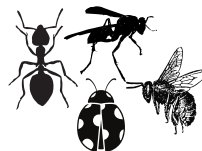

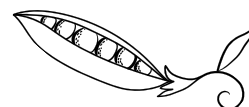
