FRITILLARY BUTTERFLIES

Arcadia NATIVES



- Found in dry, upland sites
- Blooms purple, April-June
- May rebloom in early fall
- Reproduces by seed only
- Important Fritillary host plant

FUN FACTS:

Leaves are shaped like bird feet. Must have well-drained soil free from competing plants. Native to high quality undisturbed habitats.

OTHER NATIVE VIOLETS: Common Blue Violet, Striped Cream Violet, Downy Yellow Violet, Appalachian Blue Violet, Long-Spurred Violet, Smooth Yellow Violet


Dispersed by Ants
