VIOLETS ARE FOOD FOR CATERpillARS

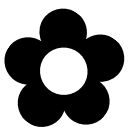


- Native to woodlands & thickets
- Blooms yellow, April-June
- May go dormant in dry summers
- Seeds sometimes eaten by Juncos, Mourning Doves, & gamebirds

### HELPFUL TIPS:

Often found in undisturbed habitats. Occasionally forms small colonies; not aggressive. Tolerates mild deer browsing.

*COMPANIONS: Coral Bells, Woodland Phlox, Golden Alexanders, Blue Cohosh, Mayapples, Hairy Wood Mint, Wild Geranium, Christmas Fern, Woodland Stonecrop*
