SPECIALIST BEE



- Prefers wet-moist humusy soil
- Blooms cream, May-June
- Forms a dense groundcover
- Spreads quickly by seed
- Flowers later than most violets

### HELPFUL TIPS:

Ideal for living mulch in shade or woodland gardens. After initial blooms, it produces small self-fertile cleistogamous flowers.




