NATIVE SHRUBS




- Attractive to hummingbirds
- Blooms yellow, early summer
- Small shrub; mounded shape
- Native to dry, rocky thickets
- Suckers freely; colony-forming

HELPFUL TIPS:

Self-sterile; 2 or 3 plants are recommended for seed set. Prune every few years for best shape. Blooms on new growth.

COMPANIONS: Serviceberry, Witch Hazel, Viburnums, Large-Leaved Aster, Wild Petunia, Gray Goldenrod, Coral Bells, Sweetfern, Plantain Pussytoes, Allegheny Pachysandra


