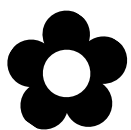


- Attractive planted in groups
- Blooms white, early summer
- Prefers part shade, moist soil
- Loosely branched; suckering
- Very intolerant of drought

FUN FACTS:

May experience winter dieback, but recovers well in spring. Blooms on new wood. Older stems have exfoliating bark.

COMPANIONS: *Seersucker Sedge, Christmas Fern, Woodland Stonecrop, Coral Bells, Woodland Phlox, Large-Leaved Aster, Wood Poppy, Wild Geranium, Golden Groundsel*

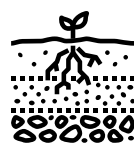

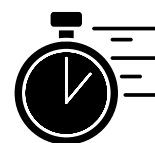
