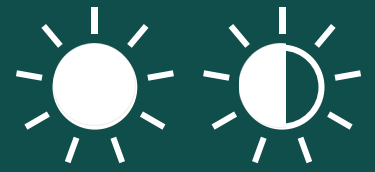

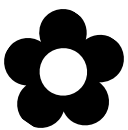
Arcadia

- Robust, versatile, & adaptable
- Blooms blue in early summer
- Found in prairies & thickets
- Easy to grow; fast-spreading
- AKA Bluejacket

FUN FACTS:

Flowers open in morning, close by afternoon, & last for one day. Six week bloom period. Foliage may decline in late summer.

COMPANIONS: Partridge Pea, Mt. Mint, Black-Eyed Susan, Sundrops, Beardtongues, Butterfly Milkweed, Anise Hyssop, Golden Alexanders, Showy Goldenrod, Coneflowers



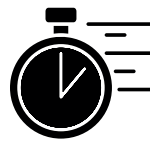
Early Summer

Long Bloom Time



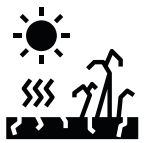
Fast Spreading
